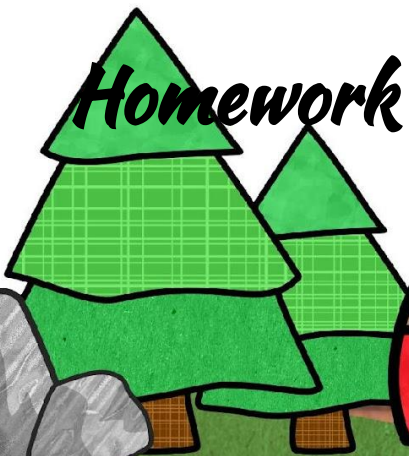

Homework

- Read 10-15 minutes (can be adult or older sibling reading)
- Practice Sight Words (weekly test)
- Practice Spelling Words (weekly test)
- Optional—math only after first 3 homework assignments

Math—Add to 20

Vocab: Open Number Line, Doubles plus 1 fact, Doubles plus 2 fact

Your child will learn about strategies to use to add to 20. Some of the strategies include counting on, making 10, making doubles and adding 1 or 2 to doubles.

Language Arts

Spelling Words: man, can, nap, tap, cat, hat, not, does

Vocab Words: common, learn, object, recognize, subjects

- **Words to Know** Help your child use the vocab words to make up a question and an answer about school.
- **Spelling/Phonics: short a** Help your child identify and generate words that rhyme with their spelling words. This week's phonic sound is the short *a* sound, as in *cat*, *man*, and *rag*.
- **Sight Words:** the, and, he, she, we, be, it, in, not, does
- **Comprehension: Key Details**

Science—Light and Sound

Vocab Words: sound waves, vibrations, solid objects

emit, opaque, reflection, illuminated, translucent, transparent

Students explore the relationships between sound and vibrating materials, as well as relationships between light and materials, including the ability of sound and light to travel from place to place. Some materials allow light to pass through while others do not.

Social Studies—Civics

Vocab words: respect, responsibility, equality, fairness. community, consensus, opinion

- 1.C1.1 Apply values of respect, responsibility, equality, and fairness as a member of a community.
- 1.C1.2 Follow agreed upon rules for discussions when responding to others and making decisions including consensus building procedures.
